

What will I study?

The course covers four main contexts -

1. **Society** covers the topics of family & friends, lifestyle, media, citizenship and global languages
2. **Learning** covers the topic of education
3. **Employability** covers the topics of jobs, work and CVs
4. **Culture** covers the topics of planning a trip, celebrating a special event, literature of another country and film and television

What skills will I develop?

- Reading, listening, talking and writing in the language
- How to use different media effectively for learning and communication
- An understanding of how language works
- An awareness of cultural differences, giving an insight into other ways of thinking & other views of the world
- A richer understanding of active citizenship

How will I be assessed?

The external exam consists of 4 components -

Paper 1 Reading & Translation 50 marks

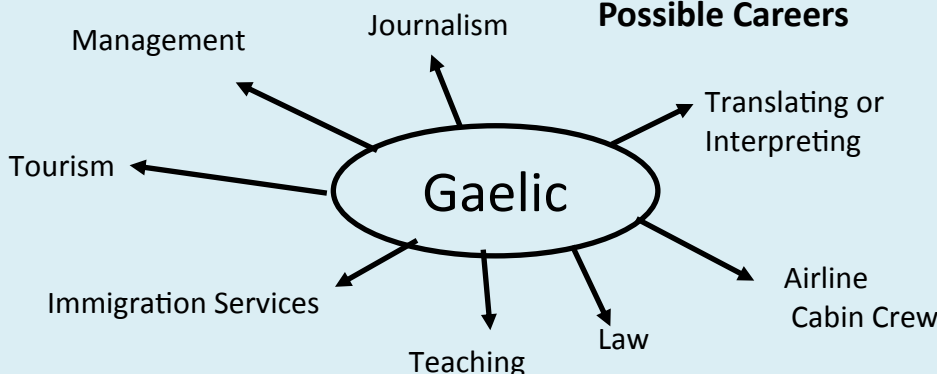
Paper 2 Listening & Discursive Writing 70 marks
