- A richer understanding of active citizenship

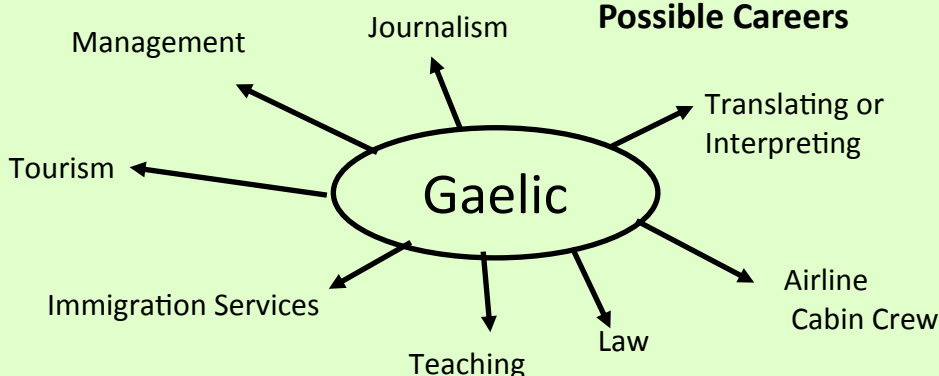
How will I be assessed?
