What will I study?

In the 21st century, with growing awareness of the impact of human activity upon the environment and scarce resources, the study of Geography fosters positive life-long attitudes of environmental stewardship, sustainability and global citizenship. The units for studying are:

Physical Environments – learn about the weather, glaciation and coastal landscapes and how to manage and look after these landscapes

Human Environments – learn about social and economic issues in Developed and Developing countries, global population, farming and urban environments.

Global Issues – learn about earthquakes, volcanoes and tropical storms and global health issues such as AIDS, Malaria and heart disease

What skills will I develop?

Be able to use and interpret a range of numerical and graphical information

Develop a range of mapping skills including Ordnance Survey maps

Develop research skills, including fieldwork

How will I be assessed?
