

What will I study?

You will access a wide range of literature and texts and learn how to use language to express and understand complex ideas with a sophisticated level of language.

What skills will I develop?

- the ability to express and communicate meaning at a high level of sophistication
- the ability to communicate in writing at a high level of sophistication
- deepen awareness of language and how it works, taking account of style, grammar, structure and idiom, and local or regional influences on language
- the ability to analyse and evaluate texts from different genres
- an awareness of translating from written English to written Gàidhlig and interpreting from spoken Gàidhlig to spoken or written English
- the ability to interact with an individual or group in Gaelic-related issues and engage in individual and group study of topics of a historical or cultural nature
- apply high-order thinking
- develop advanced critical literacy
- an ability to learn independently
- an ability to plan and research, integrating and applying language skills, for a range of purposes including independent study

How will I be assessed?

The external exam consists of 2 papers

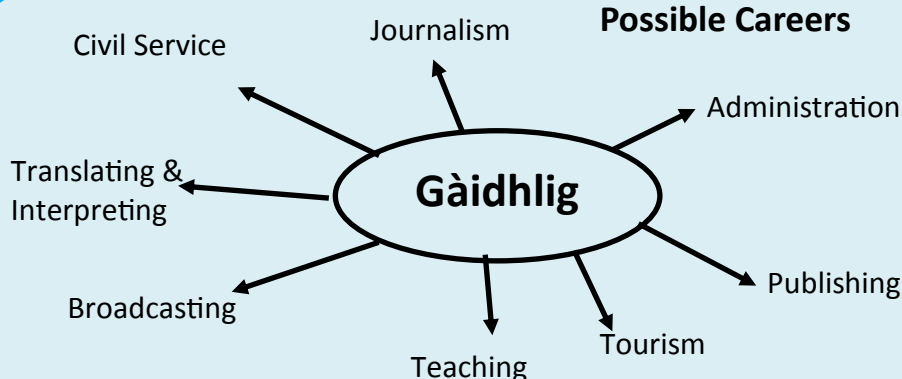
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Paper 1 Practical Criticism	30 marks
