
SQA Results

From Spain to Scotland


At the beginning of May, the school welcomed Diana Castillo Gandullo, 3rd year student from Seville for a 8 week Europe funded placement. The aim of the placement is to improve their second or third spoken language and to learn sign language of that country to conversational level.

Diana shadowed staff and pupils from the Deaf base and also joined BSL Deaf Studies classes. She also visited some Spanish classes. Deaf pupils thought it was great to learn another foreign sign language instead of trying to learn another spoken language

As part of her placement, she was asked to share her knowledge and experiences through



discussions and teaching Spanish sign language and some spoken Spanish too. The pupils quickly learned the Spanish alphabet is very different to the BSL alphabet. Like many other sign languages, the alphabet uses only one hand unlike BSL where both hands are used. There are a few similarities in the grammar of both sign languages; question words in BSL always appear at the end of the signed utterance, this happens too in Spanish sign except when asking where you live!



The S2 IDL class could only be described as wildly enthusiastic learners setting themselves some imaginative challenges including one group deciding they would try using all four all languages at once! (Spoken English translated into BSL then into SSL and finally into spoken Spanish)

Diana left last week declaring her placement had been fantastic due to the pupils and the staff so welcoming and friendly. She said she will miss many things but not the Scottish rain!

New Online Form

For parent enquiries, advice about who is entitled to free school meals and clothing grants, or to request a paper form, please contact the Operations Team, Nairn on **01463 703645**.

They will be assessed automatically and **will not need to re-apply each year**. Families who do not need to re-apply will receive a letter confirming their continued entitlement to free school meals and clothing grants. If parents do need to re-apply or would like to add a new child to the scheme, they should be **directed to complete the online form** situated on the Council's website. To access this form, go to www.highland.gov.uk/request and click on Free School Meals and Clothing Grants. This form can be accessed on smartphones and tablets as well as laptops and desktops.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if parents are not able to use the online form?

If parents are unable to apply online, a paper form can be downloaded from the website (paper forms for school year 2016-17 are now available). The contact details within this form have been updated so please do not use any existing paper forms. Parents can also ring 01463 703645 to request a paper form.

When can parents complete the form for the new school year?

The online form is available all year round and asks the parent whether they are applying for the current year or new school year. Parents can apply at any time, however applications for the new year won't be processed until July.

The new paper form for 2016/17 is now available on the council website.

What happens if a parent's circumstances change during the year?

If parents would like to report a change of circumstances which affects their free school meals and clothing grant application (for example they would like to change how they receive their clothing grant voucher), they should be directed to **change of circumstances online form**, available on www.highland.gov.uk/report.
