# **Belgium Trip**



The Belgium Trip 2016 was undoubtedly one of the most incredible trips I have ever been on.

While there, we had the opportunity to visit different sites many including the Passchendaele Museum, where we got to experience what living in a WW1 trench was like. We also visited numerous commonwealth cemeteries such as Tyne Cot, Essex Farm and war memorial sites such as Newfoundland Park and Hill 60, where some WW1 battles took place. What shocked me was the sheer amount of unidentified soldiers in the cemeteries - 70% of the graves were unidentified at Tyne Cot.

We also visited a German cemetery called Langemarck which contrasted sharply to the commonwealth ones we had seen. Instead of neat, white headstones there were black slabs on the ground, shared between 6-8 soldiers. This trip was a truly life changing experience which I will never forget. I felt, and still feel a sense of gratefulness, beyond

comprehension, for those who sacrificed their lives for us to live in today.



### **Rock Challenge: Scottish FINALS**

Dingwall Academy has been heavily involved in Rock Challenge for a number of years now and this year has been especially successful.



For those of you who are unaware of Rock Challenge and what it entails, in a nutshell it is a performing arts competition that shows young people how they can achieve a natural high without the use of tobacco, alcohol or other substances. It communicates health and social education messages to teenagers in a positive and supportive environment. The 'Challenge' for the students and their teachers is to create and be involved in their own production from conceptualisation through to the final live performance.

All the pupils have been working very hard since October last year, giving up every Friday and Sunday afternoon; designing and building set, mixing, designing lighting, making costumes, and coming up with different styles of choreography.

After a successful performance at the Highland Regional Stage at Eden Court with 'Snow and the Raven' where we came second to Alness by one point, we were now headed to Dundee for the Scottish finals on Friday the 17<sup>th</sup> June.

Our two buses left on the Thursday night with much anticipation and excitement building, especially for those who had not attended the event before. The Caird Hall is an impressive and statuesque building in the centre of the pedestrianised section of Dundee and as we crossed the square we could already hear the music pumping out of the main doors.

The whole day was a great experience. The pupils got to meet and mix with other Rock Challenge students from all over Scotland, as well as having the support of the other four Highland schools. They also got to see the step up in performance, set, costume, make up and effects that the Scottish Finals bring.

After a long day we finally performed at ten o'clock in the evening. The performance was stunning due to the hard work of every single pupil involved in D.A.R.C and was celebrated by the audience and the judges. After a long and painful wait we were announced fourth overall out of eleven schools and won numerous awards, our best result yet!

# **Young Leaders**




