BBC School Report



BBC News School Report gives 11-16 year-old students in the UK the chance to make their own news reports for a real audience. This year more than 1,000 schools across the UK took part in the project, on the biggest ever School Report News Day. For the second consecutive year, Dingwall academy was the most northern representative in the UK.

Jackie O'Brien, a distinguished BBC journalist, visited the school to support the work of Mr Dolan's S3 class. They made an audio news programme which was featured on BBC Scotland's evening radio broadcast News Drive. It was a fantastic experience for the students to gain hands-on experience of media production work. Rock Challenge

Rock Challenge involves producing and performing an eight minute dance routine on the Eden Court stage. Pupils are responsible for choreography, lighting, sound, costumes set and make up. Over 100 pupils were in involved in this year's Rock Challenge production and after months of practice and preparation the Highland Heats took place on 19th April at Eden Court.

Alness Academy have been recognised as the Rock Challenge team to aspire to, winning the Highland Heats for the last few years and a place in the Scottish Finals. The Dingwall performance this year was outstanding and the team were delighted to finish in 2nd place to Alness. Many people said that after watching the performances, they had found it too close to call between the two Ross-shire teams.

After the performance, there was a very nervous couple of weeks as we waited to hear if the team would receive a Wild Card to the Scottish Finals – and then came the fantastic news that the team had indeed been selected to take part in the Scottish Finals in Dundee on June 17th.

This is a richly deserved reward for all the hard work of the pupils, staff and parents involved. The school team were also awarded the coveted 'Spirit of Rock Challenge' award. This is awarded to the school that most demonstrates the inclusive and friendly spirit of the Rock Challenge Event. We are extremely proud that the team gained this accolade and wish them the very best of luck at the finals in June.

Activity Days

The annual school activity days take place on Monday 27th and Tuesday 28th June. Pupils have already opted for activities and the full balance of payment should have been received. The activity days are an opportunity for staff and pupils to enjoy some alternative activities together and are always great fun. University Open Days

Sensational Swimmers

John Anderson of 2W2 took part in a sponsored swim on 30th April at the Aquadome pool in Inverness. He was part of the Highland Disability Swim Team who were trying to swim the length of Loch Ness which is 36.3 kilometres, or the equivalent of 1452 lengths of the pool. They are trying to raise funds to send a team to the Special Olympics in 2017.

Each swimmer had a target, and John's was to do 120 lengths in 2 hours. He hit his target in less than 90 minutes, and went on to exceed it. Altogether the 20 swimmers managed to complete 2556 lengths of the pool, which was all the way up Loch Ness, and 3/4 of the way back! It was a fantastic effort by everyone in the team, and all their supporters of course, including those who were hard pressed to keep up with the counting of lengths.
