HOSPITALITY PREFECTS




A number of senior pupils have now been appointed to the position of Hospitality Prefect.


Nuffield Experience

As we all know, the term between Christmas and Easter holidays is busy. Between studying, finishing work, and prelims, there's not a lot of time to think about the rest of the year. So, when I applied for a Nuffield Research Placement I didn't really expect anything to come of it. However, Jennifer Smith, who coordinates the scheme in Scotland, emailed me and said I'd been offered a placement at UHI under the supervision of Dr James Cobley.

My placement took seven weeks over June, July and August, at the Centre for Health Sciences in Inverness. We studied the regulation of reactive oxygen species in the mitochondria of cells in the early stages of development, using a variety of techniques, including Western Blotting. Our results showed that particular reactive oxygen species are not regulated, allowing them to escape the mitochondria and act as a trigger for cell development - basically, early cells need these species to mature. Using the information I gained from the project, I had to write a report and produce a poster.

On the 30th of August, everyone who did a Nuffield Research Placement was invited to an event in the Royal College of Surgeons in Edinburgh. We all presented our posters, listened to some talks, and were presented with a certificate by Alison McLure, the National Manager of the Scottish Institute of Physics. I had a really great time during the placement and on the day, and would definitely recommend applying to the scheme.

Neil Gunn Lecture at Eden Court

On Friday 14th September a group of senior pupils, accompanied by Mr Dolan and Mrs Davidon, enjoyed an evening of "fine dining and poetry" at Eden Court as the Scottish Makar, Jackie Kay, launched this year's Neil Gunn writing competition. In 2016 accepting her the appointment as the third Makar she said, "I hope

to open up the conversations, the blethers, the arguments and celebrations that Scotland has with itself and with the rest of the world, using the voice of Poetry in its fine Scottish delivery." Jackie read a selection of her own poignantly beautiful poems and talked about several Scottish writers including Neil Gunn, Nan Shepherd and Jessie Kesson.

Dingwall Academy Photographic Archive

In the coming issues of the newsletter, we are delighted that we will be able to share with you some of the school's historic photographic archive. The late Dave Ritchie, former pupil and Head of Modern Studies, was a man entrusted some years back with a unique collection of photographic slides of pupils and staff of the fifties, sixties and seventies. They were compiled by a remarkable character, Kenny Laing, post-war Head of Classical Studies at the school, who died twenty years or so ago in his late eighties. Kenny was something of an educational icon and former wartime intelligence officer and his archive, of over 400 slides and photographs show pupils, classes, teachers, the old school and a large number of youngsters from both Dingwall Primary and the Academy.


