Named Person

There has been a great deal of publicity relating to the Named Person and their role in supporting young people in Scotland.

The Named Person is the clear point of contact if a young person or parent wants information or advice, or if they want to talk about worries and seek support.

The Named Person will be available to listen, advise and help a young person/parents and provide direct support or help them access other services.

When a pupil comes to Dingwall Academy, their Named Person would normally be the relevant Depute Rector –

S1/2 Mr Di Carlo S3/4 Mr MacIntosh S5/6 Ms Harrison

However, depending on the needs of a pupil, the Named Person can change and they could be moved onto the caseload of Mr Gaffney who is Depute Rector Pupil Support.

If this is the case, you will receive a letter alerting you to any change.

This is in place to support the work being done by the Guidance Staff and parents/carers should feel free to contact your child's Guidance Teacher at any time. You need not go through the Named Person to seek advice/support.

UCAS Applications

Senior pupils are now starting the process of applying for University. All S6 pupils received a talk on 21st August from the Scottish University tour. There will also be the offer of a drop in session for parents later in the term. Further details will be issued to senior phase parents.

Sunflower Café

We are currently working hard to create a working café in the school. Pupils are involved in the design and build, pupils will then be fully involved in the management and running of the café. The aim is to have the café running by January 2018.

It will be built around the Sunflower theme and will provide a special space for the school to use.

We have already taken delivery of a shiny new coffee machine! The kitchen units were recycled from Portree High School and fitted over the Summer.

The facility will be used to help pupils develop employability skills such as catering, finance





advisors on re-cycling once the café is operational.

As part of the café project we have appointed Home Economics prefects.

They will be involved in the running of the café and are already helping by providing catering for school events.


We are grateful to Mears and Alpha Schools for their support with this initiative.

Employability is a key part of our School Improvement Plan for next session. We want to ensure that all pupils have a curriculum appropriate to their needs, and that we are giving all pupils the best opportunity to succeed. The Sunflower Café is an important part of this initiative, however we are also planning a working nail salon.



12 pupils took part in an intensive 2 day programme, learning the basics of nail care and nail art. Pupils are also taught about customer care, and will have further sessions concentrating on this important skill.

We have also invested in equipment that will allow pupils to operate the salon as a Social Enterprise.



Pupils did an excellent job and took a really professional approach to these sessions.

For the next step, pupils will be given the opportunity to practice on prefects and parents.

Part of the project will involve pupils trying out their new skills at Ben Wyvis care home, where some of the elderly resident will receive some well deserved pampering.


