# **Prelim Information**

The Prelim exams start on Monday 13th January.

The master timetable has already been published and can be viewed on the Google Communications Classroom or via the school website.

Pupils will also be issued with individual timetables showing accommodation and seat numbers.

Pupils with alternative arrangements will have an additional timetable issued before the start of the prelims.



Any pupils timetabled for 2 exams at the same time should see Ms Harrison asap.

#### What happens if I am absent on the day of a prelim?

If you know in advance that you are going to be absent on the day of a prelim then you must let Ms Harrison know as soon as possible. There would have to be exceptional circumstances, such as a family wedding.

#### What happens if I am ill on the day of a prelim?

If you are unable to come into school on the day of a prelim then phone the school to let them know. Your prelim will then be re-scheduled for the next available day. So if you are absent, then be prepared to sit your prelim on return to school.

#### What happens if I am late?

Pupils must make every effort to be on time for prelims, however sometimes thing happen such as buses breaking down etc. If you are able to, phone school and let them know. When you do arrive in school, report immediately to the office who will arrange for a member of the SMT to escort you into the exam. Do not just walk into the exam hall.

#### What happens if school is closed because of the weather?

If this happens then then exam will be re-scheduled and the new arrangements communicated as soon as possible.

# **STUDY ADVICE**

We want everyone to enjoy a good Christmas holiday. However for pupils with prelims in January, time needs to be spent studying.

#### Do I need to study every day?

Nobody should study on Christmas Day! It is important that you have time to relax and enjoy Christmas with family and friends. However, you do need to devise a study plan for the holiday period.

#### How long should I study for?

As a rough guide you should be aiming for approximately 30 minutes each day per Higher and 25 minutes for each National 5. So if you are studying 5 Highers you should be looking to study for approximately 2 and a half hours each day. If you are studying for 5 National 5 subjects, you should be studying for approximately 2 hours each day. How long you study for will also depend on how much studying you have done to date, and the range of subjects you are doing.

What should I be doing? You will already have been given study advice from teachers. Studying should be about revising, practicing and producing resources. Don't spend your time producing pretty notes if they don't help you learn anything. At the end of each study session you should be able to talk

confidently about the topic you have been studying. Produce a mind map, use index cards, work on Past Papers, prepare practice answers and then talk to somebody



about what you have done.
