
She will start at her new school in May and we wish her well.



4th May In-Service Day

A reminder that Thursday 4th May is an In-Service Day. This date has been changed to coincide with the local elections and allow some schools across Highland to be used as polling stations.

The National 5 and Higher Music exams are scheduled to take place on this date. These exams will still take place as timetabled. Where pupils require transport this has already been arranged.

Parent Council

The next meeting of the Parent Council takes place on Monday 8th May at 7pm. We are always looking for new parents to get involved so please, even if you have never attended before, you would be very welcome to come along.

We are fortunate to have an extremely pro-active and positive Parent Council. They are very involved with fund raising events, but also campaign on behalf of the school to make sure that staff and pupils are supported.



ICT Update

Some parents will already be aware that the Highland Council ICT contract has just moved from Fujitsu to a company called Wipro.

We hope now that the planned introduction of Chrome Book devices for all pupils can be finalised. Dingwall Academy should be one of the first schools to receive the devices and the current target is to issue Chrome Books to pupils by December 2017.

We continue to have some concerns about the ICT infrastructure in the school being able to support the devices. However this is being looked at and the Parent Council are also monitoring things closely.

There is still a lot of work to be done finalising the exact details and we will keep parents updated as this becomes available.

We already have a small number of the Chrome Book devices in school and pupils are enjoying working with them. We would plan to provide some practical training and advice for parents on using the devices to support pupil learning.





Google Classroom

A number of staff have started using Google Classroom to support learning. This is an online system where staff can share resources, set assignments and give reminders.


There is the facility in Google Classroom to invite parents. This then allows

parents to receive a weekly summary of information posted onto their child's classrooms. We are in the very early stages of using this but hope to have all S1, S2 and S3 parents signed up early next term. Further information on this will be issued to all parents involved.



Bridge Building Competition

Four S2 pupils (Alana Mutch, Ben Grantham, Daniel McLachan and Sasha Clement) from Dingwall Academy and pupils from seven other high schools were selected to participate in a bridge building model structure challenge at Inverness College UHI. The team were introduced to the task by Industry speakers and staff at the College who run practical courses with information on where careers can take them, real life industry stories and the chance to see the facilities at the college they could work with. The challenge was given a strict timeline, a list of requirements that the design, model and teamwork must meet as well as set materials which was then tested with weights to destruction.



Prizes were awarded in the following categories:

- Bridge carrying maximum load for minimum cost
- Best designed bridge (originality & Creativity)
- Best team (co-operation and working together)

Our four Dingwall Academy representatives made an excellent effort in all areas and won the Best Team award and received a certificate and trophy. The pupils enjoyed the day and gained an insight into practical engineering and construction.


A **huge** thank you to everyone who supported the Spring Fair on Saturday 25th March.


