They gave up their own time to attend seminars, which included talks on Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths and gave them an insight into possible future careers within these subjects. Trips were also taken to the ERI in Thurso and SAMs in Oban to meet with graduates and also promote Further Education in the



Highlands. Cross Country

Scottish Schools Cross Country Championships

Due to injuries and illness, only four pupils travelled down to North Ayrshire to mix it with the best runners in Scotland on the 9th of March. However, after an exceptionally good season so far there were high hopes for both Lauren Fraser and the talented S1 boys' team.

Lauren Fraser certainly did not disappoint with a 10th place finish out of a field of nearly 100 runners. A top ten result at the Scottish Schools is a fantastic achievement and even more so considering that she still has one year left in the same age group. It also sets Lauren up extremely well for the fast approaching track season and will hopefully spur her on to further PB's in the 800 and 1500 events.

The S1 boys were due to travel with their four strongest athletes from the North Schools – Joe Arnaud, Scott MacDonald, Tam Munro Whyte and Niall McClelland. Unfortunately, poor Joe was taken ill during the week and was unable to travel. This was a big blow as the team required four runners to count and also a great shame for Joe who has been on sparkling form this year. However, the other three boys travelled down with high hopes of achieving good individual finishes. Yet again, our boys did not disappoint!! Scott MacDonald came in 12th place, Tam Munro Whyte 27th and Niall McClelland 29th. This was out of a field of over 100 of the best runners that Scotland has to offer and it is very rare for a school to have three runners who are good enough to finish in the top 30. Next year the boys will undoubtedly be looking to target the overall boys team trophy when they return to the championships in S2.

Huge congratulations must go to all four athletes who competed so well but also committed to travelling a long distance over a weekend to represent themselves and the school so well. A big thank you must also go out to all the parents who made the trip making it possible for the pupils to

compete. We look forward to another exciting cross country year in 2014 but also to a promising track season for all the athletes involved so far.

U13 North of Scotland Football


Well done to the Under 13 Boys Football Team on reaching the North of Scotland Cup Final.
