Higher and Advanced Higher Technological Studies Trip Tor Achilty Power Station

On Wednesday, 27th of November a group of 20 Higher and Advanced Higher Technological Studies pupils visited the Tor Achilty Hydro Power Station. The trip was organised by Mrs. B. Kendall to give pupils the opportunity to investigate the interaction of different types of engineers in the renewables industry, and also to discuss with engineers the importance of renewable energy in today's society. The pupils were interested to learn that water is "recycled" by putting multiple hydro schemes on the same river, and they were taken from the top of the facility, above water level, to the bottom, where a turbine shaft could be seen turning.

After a tour of the facility the group were treated to a very interesting presentation on the construction and operation of Fairburn wind farm; unfortunately we were unable to visit the wind farm due to the ice present. The pupils were also shown real-time software which controls and monitors the turbines. The best bits?
