The Guardian Schools Competition

CONGRATULATIONS TO Emily Pummell, Emma Reid and Annie Fraser for representing the school so well at the semifinals of The Guardian Schools competition.

The Guardian and Zurich Municipal challenged all schools across the UK to develop an idea that would improve the quality of life for the school community, with the possibility of winning £5000. There were three categories- primary school, secondary school and special school. A brief overview of up to 500 words was submitted just prior to Christmas. In excess of 400 schools entered.

Our entry: **Transition through Sign** demonstrated the benefits pupils learning and sharing BSL can have on others starting their secondary education in Dingwall Academy through signing buddies, the fingerspelling challenge, sign boards and a short DVD made using BSL.

A week into the New Year got the pulses racing when Mrs Kinsman received a phone call from one of the organisers informing her that Dingwall Academy had made it through to the semi-finals which would be held in Newcastle at the end of the month. (the only Scottish secondary school to make it to the semi-finals.)

Three pupils: Emily Pummell (S3), Emma Reid (S3) and Annie Fraser (S5) were selected to represent the BSL class and the Deaf base. They were then tasked to make a PowerPoint presentation demonstrating their entry, present their idea to a Dragon's Den style panel of judges and answer unseen questions. The three judges were Guardians' head of the Education, Head of Marketing from Zurich Municipal and Anne Fine; the renowned author.

The girls had the confidence to stand up in front of an impressive audience and panel, present their presentation using a mixture of sign, speech and voice over skills and were unfazed by the questions answering them with clarity and ease. Mrs Kinsman returned to school and announced that the girls had been outstanding in their presentation and their willingness to try all new experiences had been impressive. (that long train journey had been well spent!)

The local Tyneside branch of the National Deaf Children's Society hosted Thursday evening: a very new experience for the girls to cope with regional variations in their sign language. They also met Tessa Padden: one of the deaf See Hear TV programme presenters. She said, it was really encouraging to see young people willing to use their sign language skills out in the community and they should be congratulated on their skills and positive attitudes.

Sadly, the girls were beaten to the London finals but the judges in their feedback declared 'Impressive delivery of presentation - questions handled well - and great to see the idea in action via the video clip. We liked the school's ambitions and actions to spread and share this impressive, trailblazing initiative.'

Dingwall Youth Kafe (Next to bike shop on Tulloch Street)

The Kafe is open to all young people aged 11 to 18. It is a warm, fun and caring place where you can come along, meet your friends, play pool, darts, air hockey, watch DVDs, listen to music, play games, join in the quizzes, make pancakes etc. Entry is 50p. We also have outings to places like Rollerbowl, Cinema, Badaguish Outdoor Centre etc.

We are open 6.30pm to 9pm Monday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Starting from 18th March we are opening an extra evening especially for young people who have never been to the Kafe before. We will open every Tuesday 4pm to 6pm for 11 to 13 year olds, and 6.30pm to 9pm for 14 to 18 year olds. This is to give you the opportunity to come along with your friends and make it your night.

Staff are experienced Youth Workers committed to ensuring that the young people have a safe environment free from bullying, where they can be themselves. There are always at least 4 workers but usually 5 or 6 in attendance every evening.

School and Community Food Waste Reduction Project RU Up 4 It?

RoWAN (Ross shire Waste Action Network) is working with Dingwall Academy and 9 other schools on the RU Up 4 It? food waste reduction project over the next three years. This exciting project is funded by the Climate Challenge Fund and aims to help us all reduce our food waste. Did you know the cost of avoidable food waste to the average Scottish family household is £550 per year and also the food we put out in our bins goes to landfill near Grangemouth, a round trip of 350 miles!

RU Up 4 147 will be offering a range of activities within the Dingwall area over the project period including, cooking, growing your own and composting. They will also be working closely with Dingwall Academy to help us to reduce food waste, develop our growing space and encourage healthy eating.

If you haven't already completed a household survey why not start your New Year by completing the survey in this newsletter and pledging to take up activities associated with cutting your food waste. By completing and returning the survey and pledge form you will gain green incentive points for the Academy which can be used for paying for activities or materials associated with the project. *eg visits, garden tools, fruit trees etc.*

Also if you complete and return the survey and pledge, you can pick up subsidised food waste reduction equipment to help you reduce your food waste (*see pledge form for details*). All the money collected for the food waste reduction equipment will go into the Academy's green incentive fund. Why not gain even more incentive points by agreeing to monitor what you put into your compost bin.

The more incentive points the greater the incentive fund will be for Dingwall Academy.

S1 Garden Dream

Munro's sawmill have agreed to help with the cost of their "Woodblocx" system and help us to build a seating and raised bed area.
